

The Treatment of Ordinary Quantification in English Proper

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We bring together some well-known lines of criticism directed at Montague Grammar, such as

- (i) taking a stilted, highly regulated variety of language as the object of inquiry;
- (ii) ignoring the meaning of content words; and
- (iii) the failure to treat hyperintensionals;

and offer a coherent, and we believe much simpler, alternative using an algebraic variety of model structures.
